TENLOCAL LANDSCAPES TO DIE FOR // BY JENNIFER STAHLKRANTZ





Ever wonder what's blossoming behind those stone walls that line our country roads? We reached out to local landscape designers and asked them to share some of their favorite projects. **CONTE** & CONTELLC'S design concept for this (1 & 4) Armonk property arose from an amalgamation of historical inspirations and created a succession of "rooms" which reveal themselves one by one. **SWEET EARTH CO.** designed (2) this Pound Ridge knot garden with a twist—combining the precision and formality of a traditional English knot garden with herbs and natives instead of flowers. The result is casual, functional, and provides a food source for both the client and nearby pollinators. **BENEDEK & TICEHURST** helped a Pound Ridge client achieve early spring color by (3) planting tulip bulbs on an island under a grove of river birches. **LOUIS** FUSCO LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTS created this (5) modern-meets-rustic Bedford poolscape anchored into a rock ledge and cantilevered off a cliff, allowing swimmers to feel as though they are floating among the treetops. **MARY ADAMS** LINES, LLC transformed (6) this former asphalt parking area in Katonah by reorienting the garage entrance and creating this pea stone courtyard centered around a focal point statue. She designed a backdrop of espaliered peach trees and integrated symmetrically placed stewartia pseudocamellia within a sequentially blooming perennial border.
